The Fashion and Textile Museum Collection highlights the changing face of contemporary fashion from 1947 to the present day. All items in the Collection relate to the design and production of fashion and textiles, with a number of key garments from designers including Christian Dior, Balenciaga, Biba, Mary Quant and Vivienne Westwood.

Pieces from the Museum Collection feature regularly in our programme of exhibitions, practical workshops and history of fashion lectures, although the Museum Collection is not on permanent public display.

The Fashion and Textile Museum Collection also provides an invaluable resource for students of fashion, textiles and tailoring, as well as cultural history. It is possible for researchers to conduct private study of pieces in the Collection by prior appointment, subject to availability. The Fashion and Textile Museum is also very pleased to lend pieces from the Collection to other institutions.

London Underground: London Bridge on the Northern and Jubilee Lines

Mainline Rail: London Bridge

Please exit London Bridge station via the St Thomas Street exit turning left onto St Thomas Street. Proceed down to Bermondsey Street and turn right, follow the street until you reach the Museum which is situated on the left hand side.

Bus: Buses 343, 381 and 47 stop on Tooley Street. Buses 1, 188, 42 and 78 stop on Tower Bridge Road. The C10 stops on Abbey Street/Long Lane. Lots more bus routes stop at London Bridge Bus Station, London Bridge.

Taxi: A taxi rank is situated at the top of Bermondsey Street, close to Tooley Street.

Car: The Fashion and Textile Museum does not have parking facilities, and the surrounding area is residential and permit-holder parking only, with limited free parking on evenings and weekends.

There is an NCP car park where Kipling Street meets Snowfields, a five minute walk from the Museum.
